The player plays files encoded with the popular MP3 and Real Networks G2** audio formats and may allow for future upgrades of some alternative audio compression formats.



External Drive with Cables and Adapters


1. Unpack the player and accessories.

When you unpack your new player, be sure you have removed all the accessories and information papers. The items shown below are packed with your player.



2. Connect the CompactFlash™ external drive.

The external drive allows you to transfer MP3 or G2 encoded files to the CompactFlash* card. Attach it to the parallel port of your computer. The external drive cables have passthrough connectors and adapters so you can attach the CompactFlash* drive at the same time your printer and keyboard are attached.



- A. Turn off your computer. If you have a printer cable (or other device) attached to your parallel port, remove it and attach it to the passthrough on the connector cable provided.
- B. Remove the keyboard cable from the computer and attach it to the passthrough on the keyboard connector cable. If necessary use the adapter provided.
- C. Insert the plug on the keyboard connector cable to the jack on the parallel port connector cable *as shown*.
- D. Attach the parallel port and keyboard connector cables to your computer.

Notes: Most printers will not print any differently connected to the passthrough. In some cases, printing may be delayed or aborted (depending on the system) if printing takes place at the same time you are using the drive.

Most other devices are fully compatible when connected to the passthrough. In a few cases, some may lose some functionality.

Consult your computer or device's owner manual for troubleshooting.

E. Turn on your computer. The green light on the external drive will light if it is properly connected.



3. Install the Music Management software.

Install the music management software on your computer so you can compress audio files from your CDs to MP3 or G2 (Real Network) format or download already compressed files from the internet. Use this software to transfer MP3 or G2 files to the CompactFlash card so you can play them on your player.

This software also operates as a Virtual Audio Player on your PC.

- A. After you attach the external drive *as described on the previous page*, turn on and boot your computer.
- B. After the computer has booted, insert the music management CD into your CD ROM drive.



The installation program should launch automatically if your computer is set to "auto-play".

- If the program does not launch, go under "My Computer", double-click the letter of your CD-ROM drive (usually D), and then double-click setup.exe.
- C. Follow the directions on the screen to install the program on your computer.


The software has on-screen instructions and a help guide.

4. Create and download compressed digital music for use in your Lyra.

Refer to the help screen from the Real Jukebox software to create and download music files.

5. Transfer the audio files to the CompactFlash™ Card.

Use the music management software to transfer music files to the removable storage card so you can take the music with you anywhere.



A. Insert the removable CompactFlash card into the external drive *as shown*. You will hear a beep and a removable disk icon appears on PC's desktop.

Note: The card will now operate the same as a floppy drive. The same drag and drop or copy methods will apply.

B. Transfer the files to the card using the music management software.

Notes: Transfer all your MP3 or G2 files in groups to prevent reloading the appropriate driver for each type.


The player's file system will access files on the card up to two layers deep (root directory and two levels of sub-directories below that).

The player will access up to 99 directories with 99 subdirectories containing 99 files in each directory.

The drive can also be used to transfer files from digital cameras using CompactFlash cards to the PC or store files from the PC on CompactFlash cards.

C. Pull the card to remove it from the external drive.

6. Insert the alkaline batteries into the player.



Before you can use the player, you must insert two alkaline "AA" batteries.

- A. Slide the battery compartment door in the direction of the arrow and lift up.
- B. Insert the batteries into the battery compartment making sure the polarities (+ and -) are aligned correctly with the + and markings in the compartment.

C. Close the door to the battery compartment.

Low Battery Indicator ()

The low battery indicator appears in the LCD display when the batteries are getting low. Replace the batteries.



Important Battery Notes

- For best results use Duracell ULTRA AA (MX1500) batteries.
- Remove the batteries from the player if you are not going to use it for a month or more. The batteries may leak and cause damage to the player.

7. Insert the CompactFlash card in the player.

Before you can use the player, you must insert the removable card containing the desired MP3 or G2 format music files into the player.



A. Align the arrows on the front of the card to the arrows on the back of the player. Insert the card top first into the player with the front of the card facing the back of the player *as shown*. Make sure the card is inserted fully into the player.


Note: To remove the card from the player, turn off the player and slide the eject lever on the back of the player with your thumb.

8. Attach the headphones to the player.



Insert the plug on the headphone cable into the headphone jack on the top of the player. Place the headphones on your head and adjust them to fit your head.

9. Play the CompactFlash card.



- A. Press *PLAY* to start playing the first track.
 - Adjust the volume by turning the SELECT/ VOLUME control on the side of the player.
 - Press PLAY while the player is playing to pause the player.
 - Press STOP•OFF while the player is playing to place the player in the stop mode.


Note: The player will enter a sleep mode to conserve

- battery power when there has been no activity in the stop or pause mode for approximately one minute.
- Use the player's special features described in the *Player Features* section.
- B. When you are finished, press *STOP•OFF* twice to turn off the player and conserve battery power.

Note: The next time you press *PLAY*, the player will start playing the first file of the first directory.

Controls

A brief description of the player's controls is given below. Detailed descriptions of each feature are on the following pages.



DSP (Digital Signal Processor) Button

Press to select a *DSP* mode (*FLAT*, *BASS BOOST*, *ROCK*, *POP*, *JAZZ*, or *EQ* (equalizer). The equalizer lets you cycle through five frequency bands and adjust the gain of the selected band for your personal preference.

Battery Compartment Door

Open door by sliding in direction of arrow and lifting. Insert

batteries making sure polarities (+ and –) are aligned correctly.

Belt Clip (Removable)

The removable belt clip attaches here.

Contrast Adjustment

You can adjust the contrast between the light and dark images in the LCD display. Press the *MODE* button twice to display the contrast feature. Use the *SELECT/VOLUME* control to adjust the contrast. Press *MODE* or *STOP* to remove the display.

Card Slot

Insert the removable memory card here top first with front of card facing back of player.

Eject Lever

Slide this lever in the direction of the arrow to remove the card from the player.

Headphone Jack

Insert the plug from the headphone in this jack on the top of the player.

LIGHT Button

Press to turn the light on and off in the LCD panel.

MODE Button

Press to select a playback mode (NORMAL, REPEAT 1, REPEAT ALL, SHUFFLE, REPEAT ALL SHUFFLE, PROGRAM, or REPEAT ALL PROGRAM).

PLAY Button (Also Pause Button)

- Player Off: Press once to turn on the player. Press again to start playback.
- Player Playing: Press to place the player in the pause mode. Press again to return to playback.

SELECT/VOLUME Control

- **Player Playing:** Rotate to turn the volume up or down.
- Player Stopped: Rotate up or down to move the cursor to an item. Press this control in to select the item for playing, add the item to a program, or open a directory.

 Displayed: Rotate to adjust
 the gain of a selected
 frequency band. The band is
 selected with SKIP/FWD. or
 SKIP/REV.

SKIP/FWD. Button

- **Player Playing:** Press to skip to the next track.
- Player Stopped: Press to move the cursor forward to an item.
- Player with Equalizer Displayed: Press to cycle through the five frequency bands of the equalizer. You can adjust the gain of the selected band with the SELECT/VOLUME control.


SKIP/REV. Button

- **Player Playing:** Press to skip back to the last track.
- Player Stopped: Press to move the cursor back to an item.
- Player with Equalizer Displayed: Press to cycle through the five frequency bands of the equalizer. You can adjust the gain of the selected band with the SELECT/VOLUME control.


STOP•OFF Button

- Player Playing: Press to place the player in the stop mode.
- **Player Stopped:** Press to turn off the player.

Playing a CompactFlash Card



- 1. Make sure batteries are installed in the player.
- Insert the plug on the headphone cable into the headphone jack on the top of the player.
- 3. Insert the card encoded with MP3 or G2 format music files. Make sure to fully insert the card.
- 4. Press *PLAY* to turn on the player. A list of the song tracks (or folders) appears in the display.



5. If you cannot see the display, press *LIGHT* to turn on the light in the LCD display.

Note: The light will automatically time out after a few seconds if no buttons are pressed.

 Press PLAY again to start playing the first track in the list. Detailed information about the track that is playing appears in the LCD display.



8. Press *STOP•OFF* to place the player in the stop mode.

Note: After approximately one minute, the player will enter the sleep mode to conserve batteries.

9. Press *STOP•OFF* **again** to turn off the player.

Playback Features



Pause Feature

During playback, you can pause the player and mute the volume.

 Press PLAY during playback to pause the player.

Note: If the player is left in pause for approximately one minute, it will enter the sleep mode. Press *PLAY* to activate the auto resume feature.

• Press *PLAY* again to resume playback.

Auto Resume Feature

The player will automatically enter the sleep mode if it remains in pause for approximately one minute. The player will retain the following information if the same card remains in the player.

- · Play mode selected
- Repeat mode selected
- Track play list
- Volume control setting
- · Last track played information
- DSP and equalizer settings

Press *PLAY* to resume playback from the point the player was paused.

Skip and Search Features

Skip Feature

When the file list is displayed, *SKIP/FWD*. and *SKIP/REV*. or the *SELECT/VOLUME* control allow you to select which track to play using the file list.

- Press *SKIP/FWD*. to move the cursor down the list.
- Press *SKIP/REV.* to move up the list.

Note: If you search beyond the last track, the cursor will return to the first track

Press *PLAY* to play the selected track.

During playback or pause, press and release *SKIP/FWD*. or *SKIP/REV*. to skip to the next or previous track.

- Press *SKIP/FWD*. to skip to the next track.
- Press SKIP/REV. to skip to the beginning of the current track being played. Press again to skip to the previous track.

Note: If you skip the last track, you will return to the first track in the list.

Search Feature

During playback and pause, *SKIP/FWD*. and *SKIP/REV*. allow you to audibly search through the tracks at a faster speed.

- During playback or pause, press and hold SKIP/FWD. to search forward at a faster speed.
- During playback or pause, press and hold SKIP/REV. to search in reverse at a faster speed.

Notes

If you search forward during the *REPEAT ALL* mode past the final track, the player will start playing.

If you search in reverse beyond the beginning of the first track, the player will start playing.

If *REPEAT 1* is activated and you search in reverse beyond the beginning of the track, the player will start playing that track.

Scroll Feature


When the player is stopped, you can scroll down the list of tracks (or folders) by rotating the *SELECT/VOLUME* control up or down.

Note: The player scrolls from the last track in the list back to the first track in the list.

- 1. Place the player in the stop mode.
- 2. Rotate the *SELECT/VOLUME* control up or down to scroll through the list of tracks (or folders) available on the card inserted in the player.
- Rotate and hold the SELECT/ VOLUME control up or down for more than one second for continuous page up or page down.

MODE Menu

You can use the *MODE* menu to select several playback features (*REPEAT 1*, *REPEAT ALL, SHUFFLE, REPEAT ALL SHUFFLE, PROGRAM*, and *REPEAT ALL PROGRAM*). These are described on the next two pages.



Repeat and Shuffle Features

 Place the player in the stop mode, and press MODE to display the MODE menu.



- 2. Press *SKIP/FWD*. or rotate the *SELECT/VOLUME* control to move the cursor to the feature you want to select.
 - Select REPEAT 1 to repeat one track over and over.

- Select REPEAT ALL to play all the tracks over and over.
- Select SHUFFLE to randomly shuffle up to 20 tracks, then stop.
- Select REPEAT ALL SHUFFLE to have the tracks shuffled and repeated over and over.

Note: A cursor will appear before *REPEAT ALL* and *SHUFFLE*.

Press the SELECT/VOLUME
 control in to select the mode or


DSP (Digital Signal Processor) Menu

You can use the *DSP* menu to select several DSP modes (*FLAT*, *BASS BOOST*, *ROCK*, *POP*, *JAZZ*) or adjust the equalizer (*EQ*).



DSP Modes

 Place the player in the stop mode, and press DSP to display the DSP menu. You can select FLAT, BASS BOOST, ROCK, POP, JAZZ, or use the equalizer (EQ) to personally adjust the sound.



2. Press *SKIP/FWD*. or *SKIP/REV*. to move the cursor to *FLAT*, *BASS BOOST*, *ROCK*, *POP*, or *JAZZ*.

Note: If you select *EQ* (equalizer), the equalizer menu appears.

3. Press the *SELECT/VOLUME* control **in** to select the *DSP* feature. The player returns to the file list.




Equalizer Feature



Included Accessories



CompactFlash Memory Cards

The player uses Type I and II CompactFlash (or optional IBM Microdrives) memory cards. Make sure you use only these cards. Use of the wrong card could damage your player or external hard drive. We recommend the use of RCA memory cards available from your local dealer or by phone order on *page 22*.

The cards can be used over and over again. Just download the new audio over the old audio.

Model RD2201 comes with a 32MB CompactFlash memory card. The 32MB card provides approximately 64 minutes of MP3 encoded audio at a bitrate of 64Kbps.

Model RD2204 comes with a 64MB CompactFlash memory card. The 64MB card provides approximately 128 minutes of MP3 encoded audio at a bitrate of 64Kbps.

Inserting a Card

Align the arrows on the front of the card with the arrows on the back of the player. Insert the card with the top first and the front of the card facing the back of the player *as shown*. Make sure the card is inserted firmly.

Removing a Card

Turn the player off. Slide the eject lever in the direction of the arrow to remove the card from the player.


Removable Belt Clip

The player has a removable belt clip. Slide the belt clip up until it locks onto the player *as shown above*. Make sure to attach the belt clip firmly before using it to carry your player.

Included Accessories

Model RD2204 Only: Car Kit

The car kit is included with Model RD2204 or can be purchased as optional accessories from your local dealer or by phone order on *page 22*. This accessory kit includes a car cord adapter (#54097) and a cassette adapter (#54095). The car cord adapter lets you power your Lyra from the cigarette lighter socket of a car, truck, or RV. It converts 12-volts to a 6-volt output. The cassette adapter lets you listen to the Lyra in an automobile or RV safely without having to wear headphones.



Cautions: Make sure to place the wire securely into the slot on the cassette in the correct direction for the type of player you have. The car cord adapter is designed to be used only with vehicles having negative ground electrical systems. Use of any other car cord

adapter may damage your Lyra and void your warranty.

Make sure the Lyra's power is turned off before removing the car cord's plug from the cigarette lighter socket.

- Insert the plug on the cassette adapter into the headphone jack on the player. If the headphone is attached, remove it.
- 2. Set your cassette player to your normal listening level.
- Insert the cassette (Side A up) into your cassette player making sure the cord is placed in the correct position for your type of player.
- 4. Attach the car cord adapter to the Lyra *as shown above*.

- Remove the cigarette lighter from the socket, and insert the car cord into the socket.
- Insert the CompactFlash card you wish to play into the player, start playing the card, and set the volume at a medium level.
- 7. Control the volume with the cassette player.
- Remove the cassette adapter from the cassette player when you are finished.




Rechargeable Batteries



No. PC202MH

These nickel metal hydride batteries are rechargeable. The operation time is approximately half of that of new alkaline batteries. These batteries can be charged over and over again. To charge these batteries, you will also need the AC power adapter #PC611, or wall charger for NimH rechargable batteries #PC224. Use of other nickel metal hydride batteries, may void your warranty.
